- (iii) During the last quarter (January to March, 2014), Assam, Kerala, Karnataka, Goa, Himachal Pradesh and Mizoram had not sent QPR. But this time i.e. during the quarter (April to June, 2014) these states have sent QPR.
- (iv) (a) The State Governments of Tripura, Himachal Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh have not furnished details of the CFR being managed in the States and the steps taken by them for recognition of CFR as per the FR Amendment Rules, 2012.
- (b) Only the State Government of Karnataka has intimated that CFR are managed by Gram Panchayath and Forest Deprtment. The State Government of Odisha has intimated that CFR is being managed by Village Communities. The State Government of Assam has intimated that CFR reports being collected from Dy. Commissioners concerned. The State Government of Kerala has intimated that CFR are Non-Timber Forest Produce and these resources are managed by Scheduled Tribes.
- (c) In this connection, it has been observed that as per the FRA, 2006 and the FR Rules, 2008, as amended on 6.9.2012, the CFRs are required to be managed and governed by the Gram Sabhas and not by the Gram Panchayat/JFM and the Forest Department.
- 2. The above said compilation is in continuation of the earlier observations made on the salient features of the Action Plan presented by the States in the National Meeting and additional observations as per QPR (October to December, 2013).
- 3. The rest of the States have not sent QPR (April-June, 2014), which is a statutory requirement, which must be fulfilled. It is, therefore, requested that the QPR be strictly monitored and sent regularly as and when it falls due.
