#### 3. Pahari Kewwas

There is high prevalence of Geitras in Jashpur Samari path region. There is no specific mention of the diseases suffered by the Pahari Kewwas in the Action Plan Report and no details relating to flow of funds under Health sector has been given.

#### 4. Baigas

Common diseases are Malaria, Night Blindness and Geiter. Venereal diseases in the area are Scabies, Worms, dysentery, diarrhea and sporadic cases of T.B. and asthma. There is also high incidence of Water borne diseases.
