3. Do you think that the situation of tribals vis a-vis forests has worsened over fifty years period commencing independence? In other words, have the tribals been displaced from forest areas which they once occupied. Please give your accounts of the scenario supported by facts and figures to the extent possible.

Tribal reserves were constituted within the Reserved Forest in 1956 for the Great Andamanes, Jarawas, Sentinelese & Onges. The entire Nicobar district was declared the Tribal Reserve for the Nicobarese and Shompanes. Area of tribal reserve has been reduced by various notifications viz- Amendment Notification No.62/72/F.No.81-9/71-J(I) dated 20th April 1972 reduced the area Little Andaman i.e, between 92° 28'Eand92°38'E; the area of Great Nicobar Island was reduced between 93°50'E and 93°57'E and 6°53'N - 7°2'N and 10°34'N - 10°44'N. Notification No.87/F.No.81-14/72-J excluded Rutland from list of tribal reserves.

However there has been **no displacement of tribal** because of this reduction in the area of tribal reserves.

4. What methods have been and are being employed in the State for calculating area indicated in the foregoing question? Are land survey methods being used? Is the method of satellite imagery being used? Or any other method or methods being used? Please explain.

Only land survey and aerial survey have been used so far.
