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(7) The Commission suggested that health care for the Jarawas could be organized by identifying motivators from amongst them instead of introducing any outsiders as far as possible.

(Action : Dir(Health), ES(AAJS))

(8) The Jarawa needs to be given more protection from the evil influences of the so called modern society as they are now exposed to outside world. Chief Secretary, stated that necessary amendments in the existing A&N Islands (Protection of Aboriginal Tribes) Regulation 1956 were being examined for effective implementation of the said Regulation. CS further stated that Forestry operation in the Jarawa area has been completely stopped.

(Action : ES(AAJS))

Onges:-

(9) The Commission observed that the Onges were found to be affected by "dependency syndrome". Suitable economic activities should be identified and introduced to them so that they become self-supporting.

(Action : ES(AAJS))

Great Andamanese:

(10) The Commission suggested that the Great Andamanese couples employed in Government Department should be posted preferably at their place of stay i.e. Strait Island as they are in the transition period, and are vulnerable to adverse outside influence.

(Action : Secy(TW), IGP, ES(AAJS))

Sentinelese:

(11) The Commission suggested to maintain occasional friendly contact mission, so that watch could be kept on their protection and welfare.

(Action : Secy(TW), ES(AAJS))

Shompens :-

(12) It was suggested that the existing Ashram School at Shompen Hut Complex (27 Km East-West road) in Great Nicobar be renamed as- Non-formal School. Secretary (Edn) stated that the Education Department was already in touch with local units of two voluntary organizations like Ramakrishna Mission about the education of the Shompen.
