

9. In many State Laws/Regulations against alienation of tribal lands, it is provided that tribals can sell their land with the permission of the Collector/State Government for a number of purposes. What criteria have been adopted in giving the permission? Do you have such a provision in your anti-alienation laws? If yes, please furnish in how many cases permission was given by the Collector during the last 10 years indicating the extent of tribal lands involved, the number of tribals affected, the average price received by the tribals per acre and the purpose for which the permission was accorded by the Collector during the last 5 years.	Section 5 (1) of the PAT Regulation provide that no tribal shall transfer his land to the non-tribals without prior sanction of the Administration. But no such permission has yet been granted. As no alienation of land has taken place so far, no change in PAT Regulation is suggested in this behalf.
10. Andhra Pradesh has an exemplary land regulation called "The Andhra Pradesh (Scheduled Areas) Land Transfer Regulation 1959, amended in 1970, 1971 and 1978 which prohibits transfer of land to non-tribals whether the owner is tribal or non-tribal. How does the State Government's law compare with it? If the provisions of the state law do not measure up to the Andhra Pradesh Regulation, will the State Government consider bringing it on par with the latter?	Section 5 (1) of the PAT Regulation provide that no tribal shall transfer his land to the non-tribals without prior sanction of the Administration. But no such permission has yet been granted. As no alienation of land has taken place so far, no change in PAT Regulation is suggested in this behalf.
