Ans. No State Institution is engaged in collection and marketing of MFP of tribals in this U.T. The existing Co-operative system of marketing of agricultural produces of tribals is adequate.

b. What are your suggestions to improve functioning of State institutions engaged in collection and marketing of minor forest produce, agricultural and other produce?

The Great Andamanese and Onges sell their produces in the form of Copra to marketing federation for which they get remunerative prices. They are not engaged in collection of minor forest produce from reserved forest. Whatever they collect is used for household consumption.
