- Medical assistance to Jarawas will be extended in their reserve area by qualified health officials as far as feasible so that all the 18. advantages of such in situ treatment are available to the Jarawas.
- Jarawa patients will be shifted to hospital only if in-situ treatment is not possible or not felt adequate to save the life. 19.
- Efforts will be made to preserve the traditional knowledge including ethno-medicine and prevent outside cultural influences. 20.
- Codification of the language of the Jarawas will be done with the advice and involvement of Anthropological Survey of India. 21. Documentation of their families will also be maintained.
- Documents about aboriginal tribal policies and decisions will be 22. properly kept.
- Meaningful research on the Jarawas will be allowed under the advice of AAJVS to further the understanding of their life and 23. culture including their traditional knowledge. The genetic researches will be closely regulated keeping in view the interest of Jarawas in particular and national interest at large. Findings of such researches will be used for the refinement in the measures intended for their welfare and protection.
- The Executive Council of AAJVS with Experts and persons having knowledge and experience in tribal affairs under the Chairmanship of Lt. Governor will enforce and monitor implementation of the policy.
- Periodic review of this policy will be done so that the policy is dynamic and takes into account changing needs and circumstances. 25. (C.F.T5-drawal of policy)
