Administration must evolve Long term Jarawa Plan

Hungry Jarawas in the Tirur region came out to the Bush Police camps in two gloups of over thirty each shedding any hostility which they might have exhibited in the part. They were fed well at the camps and went back satisfied.

It is likely that wherever they will be in shortage of food, they will visit the Bush Police camps for food, It is not clear whether Administration had any previous contact with there groups. Likelynot. The Administration should, thesefore, evolve a clear policy in respect of these Jarwas.

The establishment of a settlement for them under close supervision will simply hasten their decay and rob them of ther free life. The objective should be to let them live in their own way and get fo ensurts that they get enough food for their survial.

So long there has been contact with certain Jarawa groups by sea. Contact over land had been avoided. It is now getting clearer that the Jarewas visited certain localities mainly for food or for retaliation to tresspassers of their Jungle areas who on some occasion or the other had disturbed the secluded life of the forest dwellers.

The contention of the administration and the Anthropologists that the reserved area is enough to sustain all the Jarawas has again proved to be wrong. Well-fad Jarawas would not constout showing their stomach for food.

The Administration must not take the Jarawa contact as a picknic party. A long-term plan in respect of these anciert people on the varge of extinction has to be evolved.
