Since thereafter, Jarawas started appearing here and there which goes to show that they were very much impressed with the hospitality, care and

and around the Jarawa belt of South and Middle Andaman. Not only that frequent disturbance in their area by the so called civilized people also increased. Extraction of timber and poaching became easier due to construction of Andaman Trunk Road. In this way Jarawas were pushed to the scarcity of food and their life in their home land was made difficult for them. As a result there of many incidents of Jarawa attacks came into light. But no appropriate steps to solve their problem were taken by the authorities concerned.
