

(v) Police Guard with communication.
 (vi) Strengthen the men and material of Police and other concerned departments including AAJVS etc.

(vii) Public representative in the form of committees could oversee the activities of the officials in the Jarawa welfare measures.
 (viii) Intensify the patrolling on the ATR to prevent road accident involving the Jarawas.

(ix) Without waiting for the Jarawa Hand Book being published / printed, copies of the Manuscript could be given to the officials / workers to enable them to communicate with the Jarawas.

(x) Compensation in cases of considerable losses due to fruits & articles taken away by the Jarawas.

(xi) Teach the Jarawas particularly children a bit of Hindi for effective communication and also introduce simple sport among them.

(xii) Gradual introduction of the handicraft among the Jarawas by utilising the locally available raw materials like bamboo and cane.

(xiii) Try and persuade the Jarawas not to take away the items from the villagers. Give them the gifts items like banana and coconut and drop them back into their territory.

(xiv) Establish a R&D Cell in the Administration to render the scientific advice to the Administration. It may consist of (i) Director of Anthropological Survey of India. (ii) Director of Central Institute of Indian Languages. (iii) Principal Chief Conservator of Forest. (iv) Director of Health Services, A & N Administration. (v) Director of Regional Medical Research Centre, Dolly Gang. (vi) Director of Tribal Welfare, A & N Administration and others to be incorporated on the need basis.
