Upon reading the Petition of Miss Shyamaly Ganguly affirmed on 24th May,1999, Who is appearing in this case in person. It is ordered that a Rule do issue in nature of Mandamus directing the Respondents Authorities to provide immediately all sorts of facilities of modern life and protection to aboriginal JARAWAS rehabilitating them in their own habitat as it had been done for the Onges and Andamanies. Further a writ in nature of Certiorari directing the respondents to transmit all relevant records including the budgetary, provision for the tribal welfare and statements relating to the expenditure incurred in respect of department of tribal bush police, anthropological survey of India and other concerned departments who are meant for the welfare of aboriginal tribes, since 1976 till the budgetary provision for the year 1999 and also the record showing the steps towards JARAWAS taken by the respondents, before this Hon'ble Court so that after perusing the same conscionable justice may be rendered to the JARAWAS giving direction to the Administration to immediately frame a comprehensive, reasonable policy for reasonable policy for rehabilitation and settlement of JARAWAS within their habitat and providing them all sorts of support / assistance and security. Rule returnable within four weeks Respondents are directed to file their affidavit/ Counter affidavit /affidavit in - reply with in the stipulated time.
