9. Jarawa attendants had eaten only part of the rice and fish which was provided to them by the Hospital authorities while rest was left in the plate kept in their room to be consumed later. This left over food is likely to be contaminated easily and consuming of such food would be a health hazard for the Jarawas. Therefore consumption of left over food subsequently is required to be prevented. If the Jarawas feel hungry, they could consume fruits like banana etc.
10. ES, AAJVS was instructed earlier to make a Schedule for the visit of officers and officials periodically whenever Jarawa etc. patients are hospitalized at Port Blair. As such he shall put up as to whether the system is being followed or not. It is not at all enough to deploy DRMS as attendants.
11. Progress in the treatment and future plan of treatment of the Jarawa patient would be required. Hence ES, AAJVS may talk to the concerned Specialist and put up in the file.
