note of this and it was apprised that there is no selective closure of activities/establishments related to the tourism as only normal day to day activities are allowed within the Buffer Zone. As stated in para 2 at page 2 by S.G. - Court was apprised that we have proposed an Amendment to PAT, Regulation where activities to be regulated have been specified. And 8 weeks time was requested for this review exercise being taken up by M.H.A on the Amendment and for a decision to be taken on the proposed Amendment. (Flag 'A')

Court agreed on this and accordingly given 8 weeks for getting a direction from the government. Court has also allowed an application for intervention filed by the M.P. of A & N. Islands to assist court but without any affidavit or to place any additional documents on record. A request was also made on behalf of the settlers of affected Revenue Villages in the Buffer Zone and Court observed orally that no such permission is necessary, and an application would be considered as and when filed.

In the last para S.G. has observed that this adjournment gives us an opportunity to re-look at the entire matter - and propose/notify an appropriate amendment to the Regulation before 4th May 2011. We have already apprised MHA to take up the proposed Amendment on priority vide D.O. letter at Flag 'B'.
