

- Regarding Buffer zone issue the villagers residing around the Jarawa Reserve
  are living in a state of uncertainty, pain and agony. Due to lack of knowledge
  about the buffer zone issue, the situation already became more complex and
  most of the villagers are afraid of losing their livelihood.
- In Tirur adjacent areas the neighboring settlers are saying we are more fear and feel more unsecure in present situation rather than past, when Jarawas were attacking in the village particularly at night. The bush police was helping and protected them while doing field operation. But present day we have more fear about the Jarawa when they started to enter frequently in the village in day and in nights and disturbing their lives in two way i.e. economically as well as mentally.

According to the villagers of the above mentioned area, the Jarawa in the present situation is well aware of their rights. Any action of the village/individual which is against their attitudes or their demands, Jarawa can make false complain to police or other local authorities. The Jarawa are well aware about the fact that if they make any complain against any villagers, whether its true or false authorities will always take action in their favor. The police fear comes in the mind of villagers and it is observed when they are going to field or plantation areas they go in the groups by doing this they can witness to prove his or her innocence if the Jarawa complain against his or her.

Implementation of Buffer Zone around Jarawa Reserve may provide an additional layer of protection and somehow may minimize violent confrontations between Jarawa and settlers, but we should be careful about some possible negative impacts also.

- -If the villagers lost their livelihood due to the Buffer zone implementation of Jarawa Reserve, a negative attitude may develop towards the Jarawa by blaming them as sole responsible.
- It was observed that Tirur, Manpur, Harapatabad and Colingpur are fallen in the valley areas which are very fertile and these fertile lands are utilized by the villagers for agricultural purpose. These areas are the main resources of supplying vegetable, fruits etc to the main city's markets. It might be possible by creating the buffer zone, a negative impact may occur in and around the areas.
- As Ang (Jarawas) have already developed bartering relation with non-tribal people, when we try to minimize or stop this type of interaction, they might approach the other settlement areas for their requirements and needs.
   Subsequently they may again occupy the buffer areas and construct temporary
