

5. Police Department should continue to document the particulars/ identity of road users in a systematic manner.

6. The Staff of AAJVS must be sensitized to ensure that no unwanted interaction takes place in ATR as well as in around the jetties.

7. In the identified seven Hotspots, where interaction reportedly takes place between the settlers and Jarawas, joint teams should be constituted by the Tribal Welfare Department consisting of field level functionaries of AAJVS, Police and Forest, to closely monitor as advised by the members of Group of Experts constituted by Administration.

8. Registration of cases against settlers for any alleged violation under PAT Regulation must be carefully evaluated by the teams constituted in the Hotspots before Police action is initiated.

9. The road users should be advised to switch off the Mobiles and Cameras while travelling in ATR.

10. New boards informing the road users about the strict implementation of Supreme Court order must be got installed conspicuously in all the important places of public gathering in Port Blair as well as near the Check-posts in ATR. 11. Secretaries In-Charge of IP&T, and Tribal Welfare may convene a meeting of Tour Operators and brief the responsibilities, do's and don'ts etc required to be followed. Weekly Press Releases may be done to generate proper awareness.

The minutes of the meeting is communicated for necessary action.
