

Dr. Mark Levene of the Department of History, M. University of Warwick have also pointed out in his opinion that the historic precedents involving the relocation and sedentarisation of the tribal people have often led to their complete destruction, even in notable cases where the State did not set out with wilful malice to harm the group but, on the contrary claimed to be protecting their interests. He has explained the same in his report by referring to the case studies of three indigenous tribes, one in Tasmania, the other in Amazonia and lastly to the Chagmas in the Chittagong Hills Tracts (CHT), Bangladesh.

Dr. Marcus Colchester, who is an Oxford University trained anthropologist and a tropical forest ecologist and professional anthropologist as well as working with Indigenous peoples of all four tropical forest regions Latin America, Africa, South and South-East Asia and the Pacific, has also opined against the poor settlement of the Jarawas and has also opined that all too often forced resettlement can provide a fatal blow to Indigenous peoples and what may appear to the planners as a minor im. et, can have serious social repercussions, since
