Sub:- Regulation of traffic on Andaman Trunk road in South and Middle Andamans.

With a view to protecting the interest of the aboriginal tribe of Jarawas residing in South and Middle Andaman, it has been decided in consultation with the Police Department that vehicles of all kind may be regulated by the Police. Vehicle movement from Middle Andaman may be regulated at Middle Strait.

Two wheelers and three wheelers may not be permitted in order to reduce the possibility of interaction with the Jarawas. Only light vehicles, trucks and buses may be permitted. Convoys may be allowed beyond Jirkatang No.II to Middle Strait and vice versa under appropriate Police escort at the following timings only:-

3. Speed limit of 40 Kms per hour may be observed by the convoys. Stopping enroute should be avoided in order to avoid interaction with the Jarawas. Overtaking should be prohibited.
