

4. Patrolling on the Andaman Trunk Road and other areas be intensified to eliminate any contact of non-tribal with the Jarawas.

(Action by Police / AAJVS)

5. The vehicles required for patrolling and providing lift to Jarawa patients etc may be procured by the AAJVS.

(Action by AAJVS)

6. Signages on the Andaman Trunk Road need to be made more effective and imaginative with help of professionals.

(Action by APWD)

7. Signages at the check post may have detailed instructions for travelers while those beyond the check post need to be short and catchy so that travelers have quick glance without stopping the vehicle to read. This will facilitate least contact with the Jarawas.

(Action by AAJVS / APWD)

8. The alternative road and shipping route from Port Blair to Shoal bay and then to Baratang be explored.

(Action by A.PWD/D.SS)

9. Director of Health Services may issue a detailed instructions to the Medical Officers and others who would be providing medical care to the Jarawas.

(Action by DHS)

10. Specific diagnostic approaches and drug regimen for the Jarawas need to be worked out in consultation with the experts as envisaged in Jarawa policy.
