

- 3) The T.D.D. after discussion with all the concerned Administrative Departments should ensure that the scheme proposed to be included in the T.S.P. are in the real sense useful to the tribals. According to the policy decision the powers as to which of the schemes should be included in the T.S.P. would hereafter vest in the T.D.D. The G.A.D. should make appropriate provision in the Rules of Business in this respect.
- 4) The outlays to be provided for Tribal Development for the T.S.P. areas (i.e. I.T.D.P. Areas) and outside the T.S.P. Areas (i.e. MADA, Mini MADA and rest of the areas) should be 75% and 25% respectively.
- 5) Maximum number of schemes under the T.S.P. should be District Level and out of the total outlays 60 to 70% should be made available for such schemes. The District Annual Plan is finally sanctioned by the Planning Deptt. On the same lines the District Annual T.S.P. should be finally sanctioned by T.S.B.
- 6) The process of finalisation of District Plan component in the Annual Plan 1993-94 has since been completed. The T.S.P. Component in the District Plan has also been finalised. In the District Annual T.S.P. for the year 1993-94, as already approved, marginal changes may be made if necessary and after making provision for the State pool and State sectors scheme, the T.S.P. for the year 1993-94 should be finalised.
- 7) As indicated in the above paragraph the T.D.D. should take necessary steps for inclusion of the all development sector-wise programmes and all outlays provided for T.S.P. and finalise the process of T.S.P. formulation and also take further steps according to present procedure to put up the consolidated demands for inclusion of all outlays in the Budget Estimates. The condition of non-divertibility of T.S.P. funds would continue hereafter also.
