- 3 The terms of reference of the Committee will be as follows:
- (i) To study the Hon'ble Supreme Court orders on the environmental issues related to forestry and wildlife in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands and the recommendations of the Shekhar Singh Commission in detail and to identify Andaman & Nicobar Islands, and the sustainable development of Order might act as a serious deterrent to these activities without commons trate environmental and social benefits.
- (ii) To evaluate the Shekhar Singh Committee's recommendations from the stand point of natural science, environmental economics, cultural anthropology and forestry principles.
- (iii) To recommend good practices for environmental protection in Andaman & Nicobar Islands while not unnecessarily impeding their sustainable
- (iv) To identify issues which should be brought to the notice of the Hon'ble Supreme Court by filing a review petition, if necessary. The post-tsunami and earthquake impact may also be looked into in this context.
- The meetings of the Committee will be held normally at Delhi, but, in exceptional cases, these may be held outside with the prior approval of the Ministry.
- Any other expert in related fields may be co-opted as a member of the Committee (as a co-opted member) provided that a need for such an expert is felt by the Committee.
- 6. The Committee shall submit its report within a period of four months.
- 7. TA/DA and sitting fee etc. will be paid to the non-official members of the Committee as admissible under rules
