It was noted that while the meetings of IDA were held regularly on an annual basis from 1986 to 1989, in the next decade of the 1990s, it met only three times, also between 2000-2001 to meet only three times, i.e. in 2003, 2006 and 2009. It is suggested that the meetings of the IDA, the Standing Committee of the IDA, Executive/Committee of AAVS may be held regularly and dates may be announced in advance to ensure monitoring and follow-up of action taken with respect to decisions on the farrows.
9. Planning Commission Sub-Group had recommended in 2006 that intervention should be limited to areas of health and food security and should be guided by experts. A expert should be made to gradually phase out any dependency that arises from this intervention. Systems also need to be put in place to preserve the traditional system of breeding animals.
10. A major drawback/handicap with the Andhra Pradesh Rules, a Periodical visit is appears to be a lack of sense of belonging. As per Rules, a Periodical visit is a must to serve in the LT for an ADULT cadre officer. Most of the officers reside there without their families and are looking to return to Delhi on some pretext or the other. Incentives for officers as well as junior staff/officials who wish to serve in the ANI could be considered.
11. A time-bound mechanism to be put in place wherein all the proposals in JTR like outbreak of disease, poaching etc and coordinate action with all concerned authorities.
