

Meanwhile, the CE intimated that the Chouldari dam would be completed in March 2003. Out of total output, 70% will be supplied to Defence, 15% to Municipal area and remaining 15% to the nearby Panchayats. It will little bit mitigate the water problem.

Shri. Ramesh Ch, Ojha, Member intimated that at present water is supplied to Chainpur villagers from 3 sources. In which, now noticed that rainwater is mixing up. As such, now dirty water is supplied to the villagers. Water Treatment Plant is required.

Smti. Anurupa Halder, Member stated that there was a proposal to tap water from the sources at Nischantapur and Narayan Tikrey, it is a sanctioned work but now learnt that it will not start due to cancellation. The CE assured to look into it.

Shri. Raj Kumar Sharma, Member intimated that there is a good source at Sukah Tikrey but pipeline has been laid from Kalsi where water is not available. As such, water could not be available for public.

Housing: - The DPC agreed to scheme within the outlay as suggested by the Planning.

Irrigation: - There was general complaints from members about some of irrigation projects like Korang Nallah, Vishnunallah, Swarupnallah, Prem Bhadur Nallah and Ramkrishnapur Minor Irrigation project which have not been started till now. All the projects were included in 9th Five Year Plan also and are coming in Plan since long. Smti. Reena Rani Roy, Member expressed her displeasure about this. The CE, APWD informed that all these would be started within a year.

Civil Aviation: - The DPC agreed to scheme within the outlay suggested by Planning Branch.

INFORMATION, PUBLICITY & TOURISM & GOVT PRESS

Shri. C.R. Garg, Director, I P & T agreed to surrender Rs. 70 lakhs from Tourism including Rs. 30 lakhs kept at Page No. Y-16 Sl. No. 2., for the developments of roads near Tourist Spots.

Further, the MP asked to drop the scheme of Establishment of Printing Press at Katchal, for which, Rs. 20 lakhs has been kept at QQ-1 Sl No. 2. **Hence, the allotment for Annual Plan 2002-03 for Tourism and Govt. Press will be Rs. 680 Lakhs and Rs. 45 Lakhs respectively.** Hence, an additional amount of Rs 7 Lakhs surrendered from Govt Press.
