



with the A&NI Forest Department and the ANET leatherback turtle camp to highlight some of the recent research and work executed by them.

The Leatherback Turtle camp at Little Andaman, a monitoring program which is an initiative of the A&NI Forest Department, the Centre for Ecological Sciences, ANET and Dakshin Foundation is one of the most significant research efforts on the leatherbacks in India. The video material generated will be of immense value in terms of education and outreach.

We will be very grateful if we can be granted an NOC from the Department of Tribal Welfare; further enabling us to apply for respective Tribal Area Permits, in order to video document at the Leatherback turtle camp in the coming year. We believe that our proposed time of arrival (**Jan 2019 - Mar 2019**) will pose the perfect opportunity to help us capture significant footage of the leatherback turtles and the ongoing conservation work being done by the A&NI Forest Department and ANET, as well as other local conservation groups.

Over the last three years the team at Emaho Films has produced several award winning films including most recently 'The Call of Pashmina' that won the Award of Excellence at the Impact Documentary Awards 2018 in California, USA.

For "The Turtle Walkers", we will be working in collaboration and close consultation with ANET, Indian Institute of Sciences and Dakshin Foundation. Supporting letter from Dakshin Foundation and ANET is thereby attached. Lastly, the names of the team members and the attested copies of the identification are also attached.
