Since, last decades many development initiatives / interventions viz. Kangapo project, Plantation in Jarawa areas, Ang katha, health interventions etc have already been undertaken among the *Ang* (Jarawa). Moreover, there are no studies on the impact of the culture contact and different developmental initiatives on the *Ang* (Jarawa). Being an externally vulnerable community (PVTG) having total population about 480, the present study is of immense importance regarding welfare, benefits and policy interventions of the *Ang* (Jarawa).

Study Area

Study will be conducted among the *Ang* (Jarawa) and the neighbouring Settler communities of Middle and South Andaman areas.
